Yuba Sutter Bar Association Meeting Minutes January 16, 2018 The Refuge Restaurant

- 1. Courtney Gengler, President, began the meeting with welcoming remarks and announcements.
 - a. The San Luis Obispo County Family Law Section is sponsoring a two-day minor's counsel training in March. Scheduled speakers include Judge Juhas, Philip Stahl and Commissioner Erin Childs. They are promoting state-wide to help address the problem encountered in San Luis Obispo County, where there was a need for attorneys qualified to represent minors.

- The speaker was Ashley Bargenquast from Tully & Weiss, Attorneys at Law, a criminal defense firm in Martinez, CA. She began by providing a brief history of California's cannabis laws starting in 1996 with the passing of Prop 215, which allowed the use of medicinal cannabis. Prop 64, passed in 2016, legalized adult use of cannabis, which is differentiated from offering qualified immunity.

Health and Safety Code section 11362.1(c) provides the framework for what is now lawful, including subsection (c), which provides that "Cannabis and cannabis products involved in any way with conduct deemed lawful by this section are not contraband nor subject to seizure, and no conduct deemed lawful by this section shall constitute the basis for detention, search, or arrest."

Many questions were asked and answered, including that an employer or a landlord has a right to prohibit an employee or a tenant from using cannabis. The point was also made that this is a state law and federal law still classifies cannabis as an illegal substance, so interstate travel with cannabis is against the law, as well as banking cannabis proceeds.
